Dedicated to assisting artists on their journey to building sustainable, thriving creative careers, Geelong Arts Centre's Creative Engine is thrilled to announce an inspiring professional development program.

Between March and June, Geelong Arts Centre's Creative Engine will provide artists with the opportunity to be mentored by leading, like-minded professionals through both online and in-person formats.

Creative Engine's free online professional development series, *Artists Accelerate*, offers creatives looking for efficient, effective and engaging ways to further develop their skills with the opportunity to be guided by respected and experienced industry leaders in bite-sized 45-minute sessions.
