A note from the Playwright

Remounting this work for our 2022 tour has given me a chance to reflect on the past three years since *Become The One* first premiered at the Midsumma Festival in 2019. In some respects, a lot has changed – American sportsman Carl Nassib became the first active NFL player to come out in 2021, followed shortly by Australia's own Josh Cavallo, who became the first openly gay professional soccer player in the world.

These are major movements towards improving equality and diversity within the uber-masculine structures of sport and should be celebrated. But we still have a very long way to go, and the pace of change has more in common with the tortoise than the hare.

I constantly move between feeling shock that in 2022 we still don't have an AFL men's player who publicly identifies as anything other than exclusively heterosexual, and completely understanding why that hasn't happened yet. I mean who wants to be the first player, right? Who wants to be remembered as 'the gay one'? I'll tell you who - a man with guts and pride and an extremely thick skin. A man comfortable in his sexuality and sense of self. A man with an excellent support team behind him. A man who doesn't view life - and his judgment of others - through the narrow prism of masculinity.

This got me thinking... is Tom this man? Does he have those qualities? And is a supportive and strong partner like Noah enough to overcome any of Tom's deficiencies?

I still don't know the answer to this question, but I hope that by the end of the play you've managed to answer it for yourself.

I can't wait to see what you decide...
